







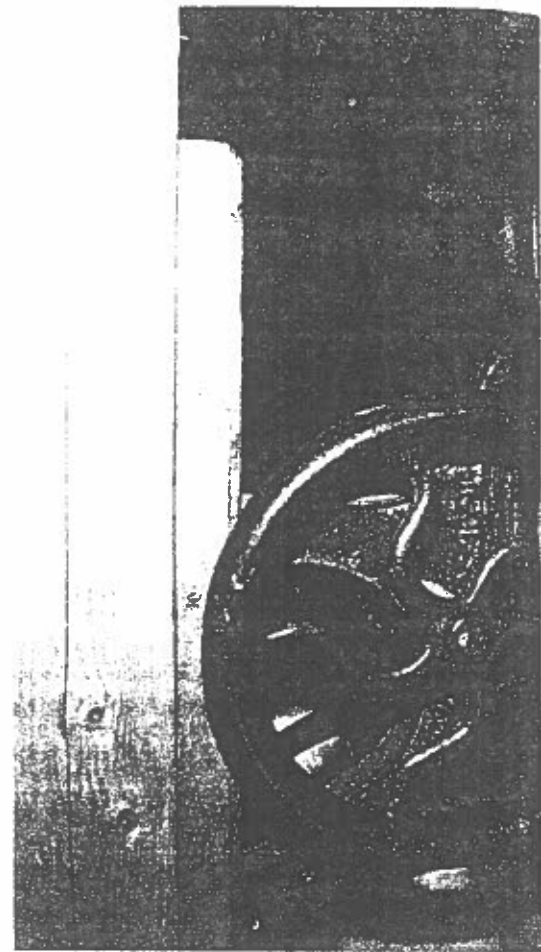




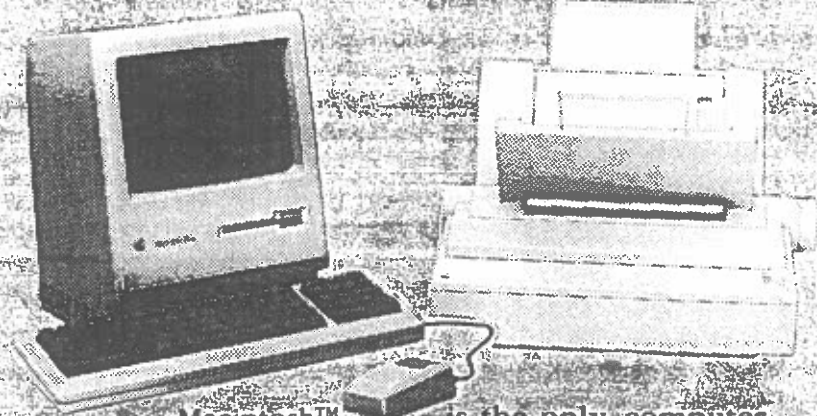
visitors, and a rich surrounding area for them to explore. Chesterfield Inlet is also structuring programmes to entertain and inform visitors while they are in the community. During the summer of 1987 a self-guided walking tour of the settlement will be developed, complete with trail markings, historic site explanations, museum-like displays, and an accompanying brochure. The original mission building of 1912, for example, in which the early masses were held downstairs, and in which Father Turquetil and LeBlanc slept upstairs, is to be restored, re-equipped with some of its former pews, decorated with old photo-

graphs and journal extracts to reflect the early days. One of the old R.C.M.P. buildings will, in time, undergo a similar metamorphosis. And the circular trail will wind out onto the tundra, past ancient Thule semi-subterranean dwellings and other rock structures indicating former habitation. Three themes have been identified for presentation through this historic walking tour: the mission activities of the Catholic church, the post-contact history of whaling and trading, and the impact of the R.C.M.P.

Chesterfield Inlet has a lot to offer the visitor: a friendly reception, trips out on the land or by boat in Hudson
